## PUBLIC LIBRARY

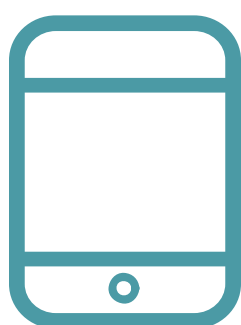
Many public libraries offer free ebooks, audiobooks, magazines, and comics through platforms like Overdrive, Hoopla, and Flipster.

## SCRIBD

Currently offering free access to their library for 30 days, Scribd provides a great selection of ebooks, audiobooks, and magazines from their website or app. If you enjoy the free month, it's \$8.99/month to continue your subscription.

## AUDIBLE

While students are out of school, Audible is offering a collection of free audiobooks for them. Titles include picture books, middle grade, young adult, classics, and fairy tales, in addition to titles across six languages. For a full membership, there is a free 30-day trial. After that, there is a subscription fee of \$14.95/month.



## DAILY E-BOOK DEALS

There are daily deals for various ebooks, where they are available for purchase at a significant discount, sometimes for as little as \$1. Sign up for email alerts for these notifications from places like: Amazon Kindle Daily Deals, BookBub, and Early Bird Books.
